Read 2023 is the second edition of Summer Reading Challenge initiated by Library DLDAV, PITAM PURA. It is meant for the **SUMMER VACATIONS** starting with May 20, and will be completed in the month of June 2023.

These are the prompt for you to select a book for the Challenge.

1. A biography about someone unknown to YOU
2. A popular science book
3. A nonfiction history book
4. A horror /mystery written by a Woman
5. A travelogue
6. A book published in the last 5 years
7. A book with a subtitle
8. A book title starts with “The”
9. A book by a native of your state.
10. A book starts with the letter M/S/G/A
11. A book under 200 pages.
12. A self-help book
13. An award winning novel
14. A science fiction
15. A book on sports/sportsperson
16. A book on plants
17. A book that has the author’s photo on the cover
18. A non-fiction best seller
19. A book based on a real person/incident
20. A Ruskin Bond
21. A Funny novel
22. A book Written Before 1947
23. A book that became a movie
24. A book about animals
25. A book that addresses a specific topic
26. Published in Your Birth Year
27. Book by an Indian author

Rules for the Summer Reading Challenge 2023

1. The participant should be a student of classes 3-12.
 2. The student must submit the report at the end of the Challenge, and then only she/he will be considered as the Challenger.

3. The students/s who reads the maximum books (**MINIMUM 10 AND MAXIMUM 15**) with the adequate report will be declared as the Winner/s.
 4. There will be three different categories for the Challenge 2023,
 1. Classes 3-5
 2. Classes 6-8
 3. Classes 9-12
 9. Choose the age appropriate books either in Hindi/English (Except for some prompt that include English books.).A child who reads most number of bilingual books will be given preference while considering the winners.

THE FINAL PRESENTATION OF BOOKS YOU HAVE READ

1. Prepare a glossary of 15 unfamiliar words from a non-fiction book, and define each word and write a sentence from the book that includes that word.
2. Imagine that you are interviewing the author of a book you have read, present it, with special mentioning of the book.
3. Make a graphic story about a particular portion of the book, including at least 3 characters, not to exceed by 6, Complete with comic-style illustrations and dialogue bubbles.
4. Imagine yourself as the main character of the book. Make a first person diary entry of an important incident happened in the whole book.
5. Write a letter to you friend explaining about the content of the non-fiction book you have just finished.
6. A beautiful newly looking book jacket for the book(fiction/nonfiction), include all the details , an attractive illustrated cover, a summary, a short biography of the author, and a short review.
7. For a biography, paste picture of the person at the centre and write about him/her in a very creative manner. Enumerating the important milestones of his/her life. *You may opt for your own creativity.*
8. Collage pictures and words that represent different parts of the book. Use old magazines
9. Create a timeline based on the main events from their book. Be sure to include character names and details for each event.
10. Mind Map: Start by writing the central idea in the middle. For example Main events, characters, plot, etc. Then branch out from the center with ideas, thoughts, and connections to material from the book.
11. Create 10 questions based on a book, preferably a non-fiction.
12. Market the book. Advertise the most virtuous element of the book.
13. Write a script for your favorite scene /part from the book. Assign your favorite movie stars to enact it. Do not select a book already made into a movie, for this option.
14. Creates the front page of a newspaper that deals with events and characters in a book just read. It should look like a normal newspaper's front page. The title should be something suits to the book.
15. The book made into a movie: Compare both in terms of all aspects.

These are the 15 options to present a Book Report after reading it; however you may invent one of your own creative ways to present. Parents must sign in every book report written. You may opt a same method for not more than 2 Books. Try to read as many books as possible. The person who genuinely reads the maximum number of books in each category will be the winner.

All options of presentation should be well presented in a scrap book, if you are good to make a scrap book of your own with recycled paper (old unused paper) that's fine, but in a neat and beautiful format.
